Of the 65 women serving in the 106th U.S. Congress, 18, or 28%, are women of color; in addition, an African American woman and a Caribbean American woman serve as Delegates to the House from Washington, DC and the Virgin Islands, respectively.

STATE LEGISLATORS — 253 (245D, 8R)

Of the 1,670 women state legislators serving nationwide, 253 or 15.1% are women of color. They include 72 senators and 181 representatives; all but 8 are Democrats. Women of color constitute 3.4% of the total 7,424 state legislators.

African American women hold 176 (175D, 1R) seats in state legislatures. They include 48 senators and 128 representatives serving in 36 states.

Asian American/Pacific Islander women hold 17 (14D, 3R) seats in state legislatures. They include 6 senators and 11 representatives serving in 3 states (HI, OR, WA).

Latinas hold 48 (45D, 3R) seats in state legislatures. They include 17 senators and 31 representatives serving in 16 states (AZ, CA, CO, CT, FL, IL, MA, MI, NJ, NM, NV, NY, OR, TX, UT, WA).

Native American women hold 12 (11D, 1R) seats in state legislatures. They include one senator and 11 representatives in 7 states (AK, AR, AZ, CO, GA, MT, OR). In addition, one woman in ME was elected in November 1997 as a non-voting member representing the Penobscot Nation.

* We use "women of color" when referring to African American, Asian American/Pacific Islander, Caribbean American, Latina, and Native American women as a group. We understand that both the terms "women of color" and "minority women" are problematic, but know of no preferable inclusive term.
