Of the 73 women serving in the 107th U.S. Congress, 20, or 27.4%, are women of color; in addition, an African American woman and a Caribbean American woman serve as Delegates to the House from Washington, DC and the Virgin Islands, respectively.

STATEWIDE ELECTIVE EXECUTIVES — 4 (4D)

Of the 88 women serving in statewide elective executive offices, 4, or 4.5%, are women of color. In addition, Sila Calderón, a Latina, serves as governor of Puerto Rico.

STATE LEGISLATORS — 267 (259D, 8R)

Of the 1,666 women state legislators serving nationwide, 267 or 16.0% are women of color. They include 74 senators and 193 representatives; all but 8 are Democrats. Women of color constitute 3.6% of the total 7,424 state legislators.

African American women hold 181 (180D, 1R) seats in state legislatures. They include 46 senators and 135 representatives serving in 36 states.

Asian American/Pacific Islander women hold 20 (17D, 3R) seats in state legislatures. They include 7 senators and 13 representatives serving in 4 states (CA, HI, OR, WA).

Latinas hold 56 (53D, 3R) seats in state legislatures. They include 20 senators and 36 representatives serving in 16 states (AZ, CA, CO, CT, FL, IL, MA, MI, NJ, NM, NV, NY, OR, TX, UT, WA).

Native American women hold 10 (9D, 1R) seats in state legislatures. They include one senator and 9 representatives in 5 states (AK, AR, AZ, CO, MT). In addition, one woman in ME was elected in November 1997 as a non-voting member representing the Penobscot Nation.
